End Notes—Capt. T. Lee's Co.

1. Captain Lee had resigned on 19 May 1778. Captain Lee's other military service was as a Second Lieutenant on 28 June 1775 in the Fourth New York Continental Regiment. He was promoted to First Lieutenant on 3 August 1775 in the Fourth New York. He was appointed Captain in the Fifth New York Continental Regiment commanded by Colonel Lewis DuBois on 21 November 1776. After he had resigned from the Fifth New York he was appointed Captain on October 19, 1779 in the Dutchess County Regiment of Associated Exempts under Colonel Zephaniah Platt. He was appointed on 1 July 1780 Captain of a company of three months Levies under Colonel Lewis DuBois. Colonel DuBois had resigned from the Fifth New York on 22 December 1779.
2. Pawling was appointed First Lieutenant on 21 November 1776 in Captain Lee's Company. Pawling had been taken prisoner on 6 October 1777 at the Battle of Fort Montgomery. He was exchanged about February 1781. By this time the Fifth New York had been consolidated into the Second New York Continental Regiment. Pawling was appointed Captain on 6 November 1782.
3. A fifer or drummer was considered a non-commissioned and was paid 7/3 dollars per month. Reduced means a drop in rank title as punishment for a military offence. In this case Horton was made a private.

4. The Fifth New York had detachments quartered in the Schoharie and Mohawk Valleys. Detachments from the various companies were sent to Cobleskill to build a blockhouse for the protection of the local inhabitants. It was named Fort Dubois after their Colonel, Lewis DuBois
