End Notes

1. Cornelius was appointed Colonel of a regiment of Additional Continentals in March of 1665. On November 21, 1776 he was appointed Lieutenant-Colonel in the First New York Continental Regiment under Colonel Goose VanSchaick. Appointed Colonel September 30, 1783.
2. On February 16, 1776 appointed First Lieutenant in Colonel Goose VanSchaick's Additional Regiment of Continentals. Appointed First Lieutenant on November 21, 1776 in the First New York. Appointed Captain Lieutenant on arch 26, 1779. Appointed Captain on July 14, 1779. When the 5 New York Continental Regiments were consolidated on January 1, 1781, he was deranged otherwise he was a supermmary officer. Basically there were not enough enlisted men in the 5 regiments to have commissioned officers and when they were consolidated into just 2 regiments, seniority in rank, an ability determined if you were arranged into a regiment or deranged. Young was appointed captain in Colonel Marinus Willett's Regiment of New York State Levies and was commissioned on July 24, 1782. He retired from service on November 7, 1782.
