

### **Pension Application for Asa Albee**

W.1351 (Widow: Abigail)

Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Franklin County SS

On this twenty eighth day of August A.D. 1832 personally appeared in open Court, before the court of Probate of the said County, now sitting at Greenfield within and for the said County of Franklin, Asa Albee a resident of Ervins Grant in the County and Commonwealth aforesaid, aged Seventy nine years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of an act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

I have been on the pension roll under the act of Congress A.D. 1818 and was stricken from the same on account of property.

At this time I proved a service of twenty months, which will appear on reference to the papers in the War Department. The officers under whom I served the one year and eight months were Capt. Samuel Warren, Lt. Grady, and Ensign Whipple in Col. Joseph Reeds, Lt Col [Claps?] I think. I now live in s'd Ervins Grant and when I made the above application and was put on the pension roll. I live in said Ervins Grant in the County of Franklin & State of Massachusetts.

I also in the month of June A.D. 1778 volunteered as a soldier of revolution and served nine months. I left the service in March A.D. 1779. The officers of our Regt were Col. Nixon, Lt Col. Smith of Hendon [?]. The officers of our company were Capt. Japhet Daniels. Lt. I don't recollect.

I resided at this time in Hendon in the County of Worcester & State of Massachusetts. I was in the Continental service for this period of service and my name will appear on the continental rolls in the War Department.

From said Hendon we marched to Worcester Ms., thence through the state of Connecticut to Fishkill N.Y. from thence to West Point where we staid a while. Then to White Plains then to Fredericksburg thence to Danbury, thence to Roxbury Connecticut, thence back to Peekskill, where I was discharged.

I had a written discharge signed by Calvin Smith, Lt Col., our General's name was Nixon, also. Genl McDogal commanded our division. My discharge is lots. I herewith transmit my certificate of having been on the pension roll—together with a deposition of my service afs'd nine months.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the agency of any State. (Signed) Asa Albee
