

Pension Application for Jonathan Albee or Allbee

I Jonathan Albee, aged seventy four years, born in Pownalborough now called Wiscasset, Maine, a citizen of the U. States, now resident in Anson Maine, upon oath testify and declare, that in February 1777 I enlisted as a private soldier, for the term of three years, in the war of the revolution against the common enemy upon the continental establishment in Capt Jabez Lane's company and Col. Thomas Nixon's regiment, being the sixth of the Massachusetts line. This period I fully served out, and took my final and honorable discharge from the army, at a place called soldiers fortune, near West Point February 1, 1780. My discharge is herewith forwarded. I was in the battle of Stillwater at the taking of Burgoyne. From my reduced circumstances, I need the assistance of my country for support.

And I do hereby relinquish all my claim to every pension heretofore allowed me by the laws of the U. States, if any; but I am not to my knowledge borne on any pension list whatever. I request that I may be placed upon the pension list for the District of Maine. (Signed) Jonathan Allbee
