

### **Pension Application for Isaiah Alden**

Revolutionary Pensioners.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts

County of Plymouth, SS.

On this twenty first day of August 1832, personally appeared in open Court, before Hon. Wilks Wood, Judge of the Court of Probate for said County now sitting at Duxbury within and for said County of Plymouth, Isaiah Alden a resident of Duxbury in said County of Plymouth, and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, aged seventy three years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any State. That is to say, that he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

That he enlisted in the month of November 1775 and marched to Roxbury and served in the regiment of Colo Cotton, and Capt. Churchills company one month and a half.

Enlisted again in June 1776 and marched to Boston, and did military duty in the regiment commanded by Colo Marshall, Capt. Prontiers company at Charleston and Noddles Island in the Harbor of Boston until the first of December following – being five months—

Enlisted again in November 1777—marched to Cambridge, and did duty in the regiment commanded by Colo Will & Capt Washburns Company, guarding s1the Troops formally commanded by Genl Burgoine when I was dismissed having served Served [sic] five months, making altogether eleven and and [a] half months service in the revolutionary war as a soldier.

He was born in Duxbury in the [year] 1758 and has always made it his home there.

He has no other documentary evidence than is hereunto annexed.

He is well known to the Rev. Benj Kent a minister of said Duxbury and also to Judah Alden Esqr as well as many other good citizens of said Town. (Signed) Isaiah Alden
