Shelburn April 29<sup>th</sup> 1833 personally appeared before me Levi Comstock a Justice of the Peace for the County of Chittenden Abijah Allen to me known as the same who made a Declaration before the Hon. Chittenden County Court on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of August AD 1832 for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the art of congress of June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832 and being duly sworn deposes and says that in taxing his recollection relating to his service he makes the following statement in explanation of said declaration.

1<sup>st</sup> that the time of my first call in 1775 was oj the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April in that year and staid 4 days.

2<sup>nd</sup> When I was called to actual service under Capt Bent in 1775 it was on the first day of May in the same year and served 8 months.

3<sup>rd</sup> On the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March 1776 I was called out and staid 2 weeks this tyo my best recollection June following went to Roxbury said 4 weeks this to my best recollection also.

4 I enlisted as a substitute for Daniel Tucker commanded on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September and ended on the first day of Nov 1776.

5 July 1<sup>st</sup> 1778 I enlisted under Capt Morse.

6 Sometime in June 1779 I enlisted under Capt Putnam for 2 months.

7<sup>th</sup> July 1<sup>st</sup> 1780 I enlisted in Easttown in the state of Massachusetts and was delivered over to Capt. Abner Howard, Col. Baileys Regt dismissed Jany 1<sup>st</sup>, Jany 1<sup>st</sup>, 1781.

8<sup>th</sup> In 1781 went into actual service on the first day of August in that year.
