

Pension Application for Amos Allen

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th of June 1832.

State of Maine

Lincoln SS.

On this eleventh day of September AD 1832 personally appeared before me Jeremiah Bailey Esquire one of the Justices of the Peace within & for said County of Lincoln, Amos Allen a resident of Dresden in said County of Lincoln & State of Maine aged seventy two years who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States in the year 1776 with Captain Wood & served in Col. Baldwin's regiment of the Massachusetts line or troops for one year & served the time out & was discharged at Morristown, New Jersey in writing which is lost.

That he again enlisted in Capt Langdon's Company, Col Henry Jackson's Regiment in the Massachusetts line for three years & served out the time & was discharged at West Point. During said three years service he was the first part of same time in Captain Langdon's Company & the last part of said time in Captain Scott's company both in said Jackson's Regiment, was a private during said service.

That he was placed as a Pensioner on the Maine roll under the Act of Congress of March 18, 1818 & that his pension certificate is numbered twelve thousand, one hundred & seven & dropped therefrom on account of his property. That at the time he resided in Dryden (then Powel borough) in said County of Lincoln & State of Maine & now resides in said Dryden & that he is the identical Amos Allen named in an original certificate numbered 12,107.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever it a or an annuity except the present & he declares that his name is onto on the Pension Roll of any agency in any State except as aforesaid. (Signed) Amos Allen
