

Pension Application for Arnold Allen

Affidavit of Arnold Allen, in order to obtain he benefit of the Act of Congress of June 1832.

State of Connecticut

County of Hartford SS.

On this 13th day of July 1832, before me the subscriber a Notary Public for the county of Hartford personally appeared Arnold Allen of East Windsor in the County of Hartford and State aforesaid aged seventy three years, and made solemn oath, that he served with the revolutionary war as a private in the Company commanded by Captain White, in the regiment commanded buy Colonel Sprout in the line of the State of Massachusetts on the Continental establishment; that he enlisted in the Town of Boston in said State of Massachusetts, on or about the month of August 1781 and that he continued to serve until the army was disbanded when he was discharged at West Point in the State of New York.

That his name was placed on the pension roll of the State of Connecticut under the Act of March 181, 1818, and stricken therefrom on account of his property. That at the time of his first application, he resided in said East Windsor, where he has resided more than forty years past. (Signed) Arnold Allen

Letter I folder dated December 1, 1925, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S.12913, it appears that Arnold, while residing at Greenwich, Massachusetts, enlisted in the fall of 1781 and was a private in Captain White's Company, Colonel Sprout's Massachusetts Regiment, and served until in 1783.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 21, 1818, while a resident of East Windsor, Hartford County, Connecticut.

In 1820, he stated that he was seventy-three years old. The date of his birth is not on file, nor is the date of his death.
