

### **Pension Application for Daniel Allen**

S.17817

Letter in folder dated January 14, 1925, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you from the papers Revolutionary War pension claim, S.17817, it appears that DANIEL ALLEN was born in November, 1754, in Holliston, Massachusetts.

He enlisted January 2, 1777, place not stated, and served three years as private, corporal and sergeant in Captain Isaiah Stetson's Company, Colonels Camaliel Bradford's and Putnam's Massachusetts Regiments; he was in the battles of Monmouth and Stony Point.

He was allowed pension on his application executed May 18, 1818, at which time he was a resident of Winthrop, Kennebec County, Maine.

In 1820 the soldier referred to his wife, Sarah, aged fifty-eight yers. Her maiden name was not given. He also referred in 1820 to the following children: Abigail, aged twenty-one years; Amenath, aged sixteen years; Velina, aged thirteen years. There were sons but their names were not given.
