

**Pension Application for Isaac Allen**

At a Special District Court of the United States begun and holden at Portland, within and for said District, on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. eighteen hundred and thirty-two before the Honorable Ashur Ware, Judge of said Court.

On this 14<sup>th</sup> day of August aforesaid, personally appeared in open Court before said District Judge Isaac Allen a resident of Monot in the county of Cumberland in said Main District, aged seventy five years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832.

That he the said Allen enlisted into the army of the united States in the Town of New Glouster in the District of Maine, then called and served three years in the company commanded by Capt Lunt the first part of the time and by Capt Turner the last part of said three years in the regiment commanded by Col Henry Jackson. That he the said Allen was stationed and served a part of the time in New Jersey.

That he enlisted for the said term of service sometime in October A.D 1777 and was discharged at West Point in New York sometime in October A.D. 1780.

That he the said Allen was on the Pension roll of the act of Congress of 1818. That he was struck form the same on account of property. That he was a resident of New Clouster when he first entered the service, that he has resided in the town of Mi not since the revolutionary war upwards of forty years, that he served in the capacity of a private soldier during said term of time.

He hereby relinq2uishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity, except the present, and he declares that his name is not on any pension roll of any agency in any State, or (if any) only on that of the agency in the State of Maine.
