

Pension Application for Isaac Allen

On this 25th day of April AD 1818 before me Augustus Pettibone Chief Judge of the County Court for said Litchfield County Which is a Court of record personally appeared Isaac Allen of Norfolk in Litchfield County and State aforesaid aged sixty three years who being by me fist duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and navel [naval] service of the United States in the Revolutionary War.

That the said Isaac Allen enlisted at Fort Stanwix on the Mohawk river in the State of New York (where he then was a soldier) in the month of March 1777 for During the war in the Company commanded by Jeremiah Parmelee in the Continental regiment so called Commanded by Colo Moses Hazen Capt Parmelee soon died and the Company was Commanded by Capt James Duncan in which Company and regiment he served until the Close of the war in the service of the United States when he was honorably Discharged in the State of New Jersey.

He was in Brandewine Battell [Battle] Germantown Battell a Battell on Straton [Staten] Island was at Yorktown at the taking of Cornwallis and his army. He was in the service of his bounty before he enlisted as above. One year and seven months and when he received his Discharge at the close of the war he was honored with the Badge of Honor for six years faithful service—which discharge is lost or destroid [destroyed] and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of assistance from his country for support.

Sworn to and Declared before me the Day and year aforesaid. Augustus Pettibone Chief Judge of the County Court for the County of Litchfield aforesaid.

Letter in folder dated March 5, 1934, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Isaac Allen in Colonel Hazen's regiment, a pensioner from Connecticut.

The data furnished herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, S.37654, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Isaac Allen.

The date and place of his birth are not stated, nor are the names of his parents given.

Isaac Allen enlisted in March 1777 at Fort Stanwix on the Mohawk River in the state of New York "where he then was a soldier" and served as a private in Captains Jeremiah Parmelee's and James Duncan's companies in Colonel Moses Hazen's Continental Regiment, was in the battles of Brandywine, German town and the taking of Cornwallis; prior to this service he had served one year and seven months (now details given), length of all his service six years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed, April 25, 1818, then aged sixty-three years and living in Norfolk, Litchfield County, Connecticut.

There are no data in this claim relative to the family of Isaac Allen.
