

Pension Application for Jacob Allen

County of Madison SS.

On this fourth day of July 1818 before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the said County personally appeared Jacob Allen aged sixty three years, resident in the town of Sullivan in said County who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:"

That he, the said Jacob Allen enlisted in Taunton in the state of Massachusetts in the company commanded by Captain [blank] Cooper, in Col. Bradford's Regiment of the Massachusetts line in the spring of the year 1777, afterwards served under Capt. King in Col Booth's Regiment in the same line; that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States until the fourth day of June 1783, when he was discharged from service in New Winsor [Windsor] in the State of New York, that he was in the battles of Monmouth and was taken prisoner at Fort Washington, and was in the said service nearly seven years at one period, and that he is no other evidence now in his power of his said service.
