

## **Pension Application for Nathan Allen**

Nathan Allen a citizen of the United States residing at Vienna in the County of Oneida and State of New York being duly sworn deposed and says that he has no written memorandum to which he can refer for the correctness of the dates herein after mentioned but verily believes them to be true.

This Deponent enlisted about the last of April or first of May 1782 in the army of the United States at the town of Tyringham in the County of Berkshire and State of Massachusetts for three years in a company commanded by a Captain Walker, and was attached to a Regiment commanded during the time of this deponents stay by a Major Trescott & Colonel was a Colonel Jackson.

The regiment was the ninth Regiment of the Massachusetts line, and the company the sixth company, and this deponent believes it belonged to the 3d Brigade. This Deponent was in the above Regiment about nine months, and at the expiration of that time, this Deponent was transferred to a Regiment commanded by a Colonel Sprout, and was attached to a company of Grenadiers.

This deponent first joined the army at [Chevans?] Point, opposite West Point in the State of New York having been mustered at Springfield Massachusetts.

This deponent went to Haverstraw Bay with the Army, and Returned to VerPlanks Point and then went into Winter Quarters at NewBergh in the State of New York. This Deponent remained at NewBergh until the close of the war.

And then with other three years men was stationed at West Point and Remained there until about December after the news of peace, and then received his discharge, signed by General Knox.

This Deponent has lost his discharge, and it was been lost for a number of years. This Deponent served about eighteen months in the whole.

This Deponent does not know of any person in this part of the County who is acquainted with his Serving in the Continental Army.

The above Statements are true according to the Best of this deponents knowledge and belief.

This Deponent father says that he is in reduced and indigent circumstances and stands in need of his country for support.
