

Pension Application for Robert Annable

Robert Annable of Hamilton in the County of Essex in Massachusetts yeoman on oath makes the following Declaration:--

That in 1775 the Declarant served as a noncommissioned officer in Capt. Richard Dodge's Company of foot in the Regiment commanded by Col. Gerrish, till he was cashiered, afterwards by Col Baldwin at Chelsea near Boston.

That on the first day of January A.D. 1776 he again enlisted as a non-commissioned Officer for one year in the said Capt. Richard Dodge's Company in Col. Loamnie Baldwin's Regiment in Gen. Heath's Brigade in the Massachusetts Line—and I served in said Company from that time—marched to Providence—New London—and New York and through the Jersies—fought at Frogpoint, White Plains, and on the twentieth of December or there about, being an invalid, the Declarant received a Furlough to go home ten days before his term had expired at Peekskills where he had been left with the sick. Col. Little of another Regiment & Brigade, who had been left there in command gave the furlough; and the same has been lost by time and accident.

The Declarant afterward served three months at Greenbush and Claverack in 1777 or 1778.

That he is seventy seven years of age and from his reduced circumstances in life is in need of assistance from his country for support: and he relinquishes all claim to any pension heretofore allowed him by the laws of the United States. (Signed with his mark) Robert Annable
