

**Pension Application for Thomas Applebee**

At the Supreme Court of Judicature holden at Portsmouth within and for the County of Rockingham on third Tuesday of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.

On the twentieth day of February aforesaid personally appeared in open court being a Court of Record for said State of New Hampshire in and for said County of Rockingham – Thomas Appleby of Milton in the County of Strafford in said State aged seventy two years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the Act of Congress the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818, and the first of May 1820—That he the said said [sic] Thomas Appleby enlisted in the month of April 1782 for the term of three years in the company commanded by Captain Marshall in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Tupper in the line of the State of Massachusetts on the Continental Establishment that he joined said corps near West point in the State of New York that he served in said corps until the fall of 1782 when Capt Marshalls Company was transferred to the first Regiment in the line of said State under the command of Colonel Joseph Vose that he continued to serve in said corps until the fall of the year 1783 when said Regiment was broken up and he was transferred to the Regiment commanded by Colonel Hull that he continued to serve in said corps until the 30<sup>th</sup> day of June 1784 when he was honorably discharged at West Point in the State of New York as will appear by his original discharge now in the pension office.

That his name has been placed on the pension list and dropt therefrom on account of his property.

That the following Schedule contains all his property his necessary clothing & bedding [bedding] viz.

His real estate lying in said Milton where he now lives valued at 720.00

One Horse 30-four cows 52 82.00

Six Sheep 12.00 one table 1.50 13.50

On old Kettle 1.00 1.00

One pot 75 c one tea kettle .58 1.33

Six knives and forks 33 c & old chain 1.50 1.83.

\$819.66

That he is owing the sum of four hundred dollars and has no means of paying said debt except by the above property. Thomas Applebee

And in pursuance of the Act of Congress of the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818

and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818. And that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me" nor have I any income other than what is contained in the foregoing schedule by me subscribed.

My occupation is that of a farmer but from age and infirmities am able to do but little towards my support. I have in my family my wife aged fifty eight years who is much out of health two sons one aged twenty and the other eighteen years of age and a grand daughter aged thirteen years of age.
