

Pension Application for Nathan Atwood

I Nathan Atwood of Bucksport in the County of Hancock Yeoman do hereby testify & say that on or about the first of January 1776 I inlisted [enlisted] into the Continental Service for one year; in Capt Charles Cushings Company & Col. Grotons Regt. Heaths Brigade. I joined my Regiment at Cambridge.

We continued thence till the British left Boston. When we marched to New York, and from thence to Montreal, and from thence to St. Johns, on Lake Champlain, from thence we shipped on board the fleet under Arnold, & were defeated by the British.

I joined our Regiment again at Ticonderoga on or about the first of October. From whence we returned back to the Jerseys & New York, & we continued at Morristown till the first of January when my time expired. Our pay could not then be obtained & I Stayed for a month longer, when I was honorably discharged.

I have since lost my discharge. I am now under reduced circumstances & need the assistance of my Country for support.
