

Pension Application for John Badgero or Badgerro

W.1801 (Widow: Sally, Married in summer of 1825.) John died in August 1840.

On this twenty ninth day of April A.D. 1818 before me, the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Genesee personally appeared John Badgero aged fifty seven years resident in said County of Genesee and State of New York who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. That the said John Badgero enlisted in the City of Albany in a company commanded by Capt. James Gray in the Regiment commanded by Col'n Gosse Vanscoyk being the first New York Regiment in the month of January or February in the year 1780 for and during the war and that he served about three years and was then discharged at Snake Hill in the State of New York and that he was in the Battle at Crouten River and at the Battle of taking [?] Col'n Wallier and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said service.
