

Pension Application for Samuel Bagley

Brookfield in the County of Grange Dist & State afs'd on this 31st day of July AD 1832 Personally appeared in open Court before the Hon. The Probate Court, Present the Hon. Frederick Griswold Esqr., Judge now sitting in said Brookfield, being a Court of record Samuel Bagley a resident of said Brookfield in said Dist. County and State,-aged 78 years who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That in the last of the year 1774 or first of 1775 he was detached as a minute man from the town of Williamsburg Mass under Capt Abel Thayer and performed duty every week for two until April 1775 at which time he was called for and went to meet the enemy at Concord & Lexington and after the retreat was stationed at Cambridge, Roxbury & Dorchester and served for 8 months after that time expired I again enlisted for two months more and served that time. The field officers were Fellows, Ager & Tupper.

He also enlisted again at said Williamsburg for 2 months under Capt Jon'h Warner and went to the North river and was at the taking of Burgoyne. Col. Chapidn commanded the Regt. Capt Warner was wounded-and that he has no documentary evidence and that he knows of no person whose testimony he can procure who can testify to his service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension Roll of the agency of any state.
