

**Pension Application for Samuel Ball**

Letter in folder dated February 3, 1928, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S.44586 it appears that Samuel Ball enlisted at South Hadley, Hampshire County, Massachusetts in March 1777, served as a private in Captain Josiah Smith's Company, Colonel Thomas Marshall's Massachusetts Regiment, was in the battle of Fort Ann and served until in January 1780.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 29, 1818 while a resident of Sempronius, Cayuga County, New York, then aged seventy-five years.

In 1820 his wife Ruth was aged sixty-six years. No further data on file as to family. Date of Soldier's marriage and maiden name of wife not stated.

The Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to Lawrence Powers, all spellings of his whole name searched.
