

### **Pension Application for Moses Bardean**

Letter in folder dated July 28, 1938, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Moses Barden, born July 15, 1756 at Uxbridge, Massachusetts, died at Prattsburg, Steuben County, New York.

The data furnished herein were obtained from papers on file in claim for pension, S.13962, based on the military service of Moses Bardean, as the name is shown in the claim.

Moses Bardean was born July 15, 1759 in Uxbridge, Worcester County, Massachusetts. The names of his parents were not given.

Moses Bardean resided in said Uxbridge during the Revolutionary War. He enlisted in the spring of 1775 and served eight months as private in Captain Batchelor's company in Colonel Joseph Read's Massachusetts regiment. He enlisted immediately afterward and served in Captain Seagrave's company in Colonel Joseph Read's regiment, was transferred to Captain Dimond Morton's company, Colonel Knox's regiment of artillery, was in the battle of Trenton, length of service one year. He enlisted in the spring of 1778, served eight months in Captain Batchelor's company.

Moses Bardean lived after the Revolution in Croydon, New Hampshire, Otsego County, New York, Genesee County, New York, thence to Prattsburg, Steuben County, New York.

The soldier, Moses Mardean, was allowed pension on his application executed October 2, 1832, at which time he was living in Prattsburg, New York, where he had lived about seventeen years.

The papers on file in this claim contain no reference to the family of the soldier.

[His records show he was along the North River (Hudson) and Peekskill]
