

### **Pension Application for Edward Bare**

W.16825 (Widow: Margaret. In 1838 Margaret was eighty one when she applied for Edward's pension.) Margaret died February 24, 1839. Surviving children: William Bare, Margaret Odell, Nancy Purdy, and Rachael Earl (wife of Samuel Earl).

District of New York

Westchester County SS.

On this twenty-second day of April 1818 before me the subscriber of one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for Westchester County which is a Court of Record of the State of New York, personally appeared Edward Bare aged fifty five years resident in Westchester County in the said district who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War". That he the said Edward Bare enlisted in the year of 1780 the precise time not recollected in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Doty in Colonel Lamb's Regiment of Artillery of New York Line and that he continued to serve in the said company in the service of the United States until the end and conclusion of the war when he was discharged from service at West Point in the State of New York.

That he was in the Battle of YorkTown at the capture of Lord Cornwallace, and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
