

Pension Application for Thomas Barnes

I Thomas Barnes of Walden, in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts of lawful age, do Testify and say That during the Revolutionary war viz. in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred & seventy six (or thereabout) I served one year as a private soldier in Capt Naler Hatch's company in Col Bond Regiment of infantry on the Continental Establishment and that the services of said Regiment were performed on the Northern frontier & in Canada.

And I do further testify and say that I entered the aforesaid in the aforesaid Company near the close of the year AD 1775 or the fore part of the year 1776 and that I continued one year in said service, excepting two months or thereabout at the close of the year I was sick, in the hospital part of the time and on furlow for the other part, and that I was not with the Regiment at the expiration of the term of service on that account, and that I was not paid nor discharged until my return home, and that on the return of Capt Hatch to Malden, I received my wages and probably my discharge which it is not in my power to find.

And I do further testify and say that the reason of my reduced circumstances, and age & bodily infirmities I need assistance from my country for support.
