

### **Pension Application for Samuel Bartholomew**

Letter in folder dated September 19, 1929, written in response to an inquiry.

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S.339999, it appears that Samuel Bartholomew enlisted in May 1775 and served as a private in Captain Isaac Noble's Company, Colonel Easton's Massachusetts Regiment until the close of the year.

He enlisted in December, 1775 or January 1776 and served one year in Captain Ames Walbridge's Company, Colonel Joseph Read's Massachusetts Regiment.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 6, 1818, at which time he was living at Woodstock, Windham County, Connecticut.

In 1820, he stated that he was seventy-two years of age and was residing in Hardwick, Worcester County, Massachusetts, and referred to his wife as aged fifty-eight years but did not give her name.

In a deposition by Peter Walbridge, he stated that Bartholomew was enlisted December 23, 1775, and that he was a fifer with Bartholomew. They were first stationed in Dorchester near Boston Commonwealth and marched from Dorchester to the City of New York and that the s'd Bartholomew served in s'd company on Long Island and other places adjacent to New York and White plains and was honorable Discharged. State of Connecticut, August 29, 1818.
