

### **Pension Application for Aaron Bartlett or Bartlet**

W.16830 (Widow: Joanna) Married November 25, 1775. He died April 22, 1823.  
Letter in folder dated August 8, 1930, written in response to and inquiry.

You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary "War pension claim, W.16830, that Aaron Bartlett or Bartlet enlisted January 1, 1776, and served for one year in Captain Aaron Haynes' Company, Colonel Asa Whitcomb's Massachusetts Regiment.

He enlisted in 1780, and served for nine months in Captain Smith' Company, Colonel Calvin Smith's Massachusetts Regiment and was discharged December 5, 1780, at West Point, New York. It is not stated whether he served in the Lexington alarm.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 20, 1818, at which time he was a resident of Eaton, Madison County, New York, and was aged sixty-six years.

He died April 22, 1823.

The soldier married November 25, 1775, at Shutesbury, Massachusetts, Joanna Perkins, who was born August 10, 1775. They were married by the Reverend Mr. Hill. The soldier was then of Leverett, Massachusetts, and she of Amherst, Massachusetts.

She was allowed pension on her application executed March 29, 1837, while a resident of Eaton, Madison County, New York.

They had seven children:--Benjamin, the eldest, in 1839 was aged between sixty and sixty-two years; Abigail, Aaron, Joanna, a child who died in infancy, Sally, and Nancy, who was born in March 1788, and married Simpson.
