

Pension Application for Haynes Bartlett

Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832.

State of New York

Seneca County SS.

On this second day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two personally appeared in open court before Luther F. Stevens, Jonas Seely, and Jacob Lazzellere Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in the County of Seneca now sitting, Haynes Bartlett a resident of the Town of Romulus in the County and State aforesaid aged seventy five years and upwards who first being duly sworn according to Law, doth, on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

I was born in the year 1757 on the fourth day of March at the Village of Newburgh now in Orange County and State of New York—No record of my age, only what my mother told me.

When I entered the service of the United States, I lived in the Town of Cornwall in the County of Orange and State aforesaid—and since, I have mostly lived in the now County of Seneca; where I now live, for thirty eight years.

I volunteered or enlisted under the different officers as under stated according to my recollection.

In the latter part of October 1775 I volunteered in Captain Thomas Moffatts, Minute company—went into service at New Windsor and Fort Constitution—was dismissed in January '76.

On the twelfth day of March '76 I volunteered or enlisted into Captain Denton's Company marched immediately to New York by the way of Ramapoo, Perammus & Hackensack, joined Col. Rudolphus Ritzma's Regiment, Lord Sterling's or General Sterling's Brigade, afterwards General McDugall's Brigade—fortifying on Governor's Island and Fort Lee—In Sept. Regiment moved to Haerlem—to White Plains—To Trenton in Jersey after the Hessians were taken on the 26th of December company returned home. This campaign was nine months and better.—

In January '77 I volunteered or enlisted under Capt. Seth Marvin for three months went on the lines at Ramapoo, Col. McLaughlin commanding the Regiment, James Clinton commanding general. Afterwards in May '77 joined or enlisted in Capt. Ebenezer Woodhull's Militia Dragoon Company went down on the lines at Ramapoo from there to Fort Montgomery—Col. Dubois and Col. Malcomb commanding Regiments—George Clinton commanding general after the fort was taken by the enemy was at Eusopus when it was burnt and at MarbleTown—was dismissed in the latter part of November or the first of December, this service was seven months—and in '78 was out on alarms often and at one time at Clarkstown on the lines was out more than a month as a dragoon under Capt. Woodhull.

No service of the dragoons company to which I belonged being required in '81 I enlisted in July '81 under Captain Henry Brewster for four months—mustered at Newburgh—joined Col. Wisenvelt's Regiment at Fishkill—went with Regiment to White Plains—from there to Peekskill—then to Albany from there to Saratoga encamped on the ground where General Burgoine surrendered General Stark commanding there.

I was out in the service a great number of times and in every year more or less from the commencement of the war to its close besides the times I have stated that I cannot prove and from the length of time that has since elapsed have forgotten the particulars of such services.

The said Haynes Bartlett hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state.
