

Pension Application for Solomon Bartlett

On this fifth day of July 1818 before me Elijah Paine Judge of the District Court for the Vermont District personally appeared Solomon Bartlett aged sixty two years resident in Plainfield in said District, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision of the late act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war"—

That he the said Solomon Bartlett enlisted in Brookfield in the State of Massachusetts in the Company commanded by Captain Nathan Goodale in Colonel Rufus Putnams Regiment in the Massachusetts in the month of February 1777 for three years, that he continued to serve in said Corps or in the service of the United States until some time in the month of April 1778 when he hired a man to take his place & as then discharged at West Point in the State of New York & that he has lost his discharge— That he was in come of the actions at the Capture of Burgoyne.

And that he is in reduced circumstances & stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support, and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
