

Bounty Land for John Bateman

Issued July 30, 1793

Letter in folder written June 5, 1926, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you than from the records of this Bureau it appears that two hundred acres of bounty land were allowed on Warrant 2626 which was issued July 30, 1793, on account of the services of John Bateman, a Lieutenant in the New York Line, War of the Revolution.

There are no further data on file as to the soldier and no data as to his family, owing to the destruction of papers in bounty land claims when the War Office was burned in 1800.

The above noted is the only soldier by the name of John Bateman, found on the Revolutionary War records of this Bureau, and there is no record of a Barnette Bateman.
