

Pension Application for Daniel Bayley or Baley

At a Court of Common Pleas held at the Court House in the Village of Poughkeepsie in and for the County of Dutchess in the State of New York on Monday the twenty sixth day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty.

Present the Hon' l James Smith First Judge; Daniel C. VerPlanck, Abraham D. VanWyck, Thomas Sweet, Esquires Judges.

Dutchess County SS. Be it remembered that on the 26th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared in the Court of Common Pleas in open court the said court being a Court of Record for the County of Dutchess in the State of New York, Daniel Bailey aged about sixty years resident in the town of Fishkill in the County of Dutchess & State of New York who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows. That he enlisted in a company commanded by Capt. James Percie in a regiment in the New York Line of the Continental Army commanded by Colonel Henry B. Livingston for three years, that he does not recollect the year the year in which he enlisted that he was at the battle at the taking of Burgoine, that he served in the full term of his three years under Cols. Livingston, Reiqneur and Weisenfelt until he was discharged at Rockaway bridge in New Jersey.

And that his original declaration is dated the seventh day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and that his pension certificate is No. 2597.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen [citizen] of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it was to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act of provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed to wit—

Real estate I have none. Personal estate, wearing apparel and bedding excepted as follows. 13 Chairs, Old Dresser, Lot of crockery & eathern, 2 tables, andirons, 2 pots, shovel & Tongs, 1 Tea Kettle, Axe.

That his family consists of himself and wife aged upwards of sixty years and one daughter aged eighteen years. That he is by occupation a labourer and has been the necessity occasionally of applying to his neighbours for assistance to support himself & family. (Signed with his mark) Daniel Bailey
