Pension Application for Adam Beals

On this Second day of April AD 1818 before me the subscriber, Judge of Probate for the said District, personally appears, Adam Beals aged sixty four years resident in S. Albans in the said District, wo being by me first duly sworn, according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of congress entitled, "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary War".

That he the said Adam Beals enlisted in Cambridge in the State of Massachusetts [?] was after the Lexington Battle enlisted for eight months in the Company commanded by Captain Webster in Col. Tellars regiment. That he continued to serve in said Corps & in the service of the United States the whole eight months. That he the said Adam Beals enlisted in Northhampson in the State of Massachusetts in the company commanded by Captain Chapin in Col Porters Regiment in the Month of January or Feby in 1776 for one years. That he continued to serve in said Corps & in the service of the United States until January or Feby 1777. When he was discharged from service near Morristown in the state of New Jersey and at the request of Genl Washington he served fifteen days after his term expired. That he was in the battle at the siege of Quebec at three rivers in Canada. Afterwards was at the Capture of Burgoyne in Oct 1777 in the militia and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in her power of his said services.
