

Pension Application for Enoch Beals

On the first day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, Judge of the Court of Probate for the said District personally appears Enoch Beal's aged fifty nine years, resident in the St. Alban's in the said District, wo being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late of [sic] Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war. That he the said Enoch Beals enlisted in the month of Feby or March 1776 in Chesterfield in the state of Massachusetts for one year, in the company commanded by Captain Chapin & in Col. Porters Regiment in Massachusetts line that he continued to serve in s'd Corps or some of the United States service with the Massachusetts [?] March AD 1777 that he was discharged at or near Kingsbridge in the State of New York—he again enlisted for ten months in the year 1778 in the Company Commanded by Cap Pomery in Col [blank] Regiment that he continued to serve in the said Corps until the period of his enlistment expired when he was discharged at Albany from service, that he was in the battles of the siege in Quebec at Lake George and was of the three hundred that were too prisoners the 52nd British Regiment near Ticonderoga. The [?] in Command by Col Brown & Col Harris – was at the Capture of Genl Burgoyne at the battle in White Plains; assisted in driving the enemy across the Kingsbridge and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support—and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
