

Pension Application for Ebenezer Bean

On this twenty seventh day of April AD 1818 before me the subscriber, Judge of the Court of Probate and first associate Justice of the Circuit Court of Common Pleas in said Commonwealth personally appears Ebenezer Bean aged eighty year, a resident of Limerick in said Circuit, who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain a provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and navel service of the United States in the revolutionary war.

That he the said Bean enlisted in the month of April AD 1776 for one year into the company commanded by Capt Jabes Lane, belonging to the ninth Regiment commanded by Colo Varnham in Rhode Island Line.

That he served out said year and was regularly discharged at Peekskill in York State.

That from his reduced circumstances in life he stands in need of assistance from his country for support--& that Capt John Lone comanded [commanded] the company for about two months after he joined it.

And in addition—the Deposition of James Woodman a credible witness, taken before a magistrate duly qualified to take the same, states that he well knew the said Ebenezer Bean & that he inlisted in the year AD 1776 into the company then commanded by Capt. John Lone for one year & that he served out faithfully twelve months as a soldier in the service of the United States.
