

### **Pension Application for Jonathan Bean**

I Jonathan Bean, a resident citizen of the United States of America, an inhabitant of Bethel in the county of Oxford and State of Massachusetts, being sixty four years of age, do testify and say that on the fourteenth day of June AD 1778, I joined the army of said United States on the continental establishment at White Plains, N. York, and served as a private soldier in Capt. William Mabury's company, Col. Tupper's regiment Gen. John Pattersons brigade in the Massachusetts line, for the term of nine months, which term I fully served, partly at said White Plains partly at West point, partly at Hartford and Fishkill, and at the expiration of said term of nine months, I received at West Point, an honorable discharge which I have since accidently lost.

I further testify that by reason of my reduced circumstances in life, I stand in need of assistance from my country for support, and that I am not borne on any pension list of the United States. (Signed with his mark) Jonathan Bean.
