

Pension Application for Isaac Beatley

On this 14 April 1818, before me the Subscriber, first Judge of the County of orange in the State of New York, personally appeared Isaac Beatley aged 66 years resident in Munroe in said County, who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled “an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War”.

That he the said Isaac Beatley enlisted in Boston in the State of Massachusetts, in the Company commanded by Capt. Hosea Stutson, Coln Bradford’s Regt in the Massachusetts line—that he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States until the end of the war, when he was discharged at New Windsor by Genl Patterson. That he was in the battle of the taking of Burgoyne & Quebeck—

And that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support and that he has no other evidence of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. (Signed with his mark) Isaac Beatley
