

Pension Application for Arthur Beatty

W.20694 (Widow: Elizabeth Sudderly) Married December 3, 1792, by Rev Mr. Labach, Pastor of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church in Kinderhook. Arthur died Dec. 10, 1836. [Transcriber's note, can't read Arthur's deposition.]

County of Albany SS.

On this 13th day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight personally appeared before the Justice's Court of the City of Albany (The same being a court of record) Elizabeth Beatty, a resident of the Town of Coxsackie in the County of Green aged sixty five years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7, 1838, entitled "an act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows"—

That she is the widow of Arthur Beatty who was a soldier in the service of the United States in the Revolutionary War, & at the time of his death, a Pensioner under the Act of Congress of June 7, 1832.

She further declares that she was married to the said Arthur Beatty, on the twenty third day of December in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety two; --that her Husband the aforesaid Arthur Beatty died on the tenth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty six; that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first of January seventeen hundred and ninety four, viz, at the time above stated.

That her name previous to her marriage was Elizabeth Sudderly.—that she was married in the Town of Kinderhook in the County of Columbia by the Rev'd Mr. Labach, then the Pastor of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church in the Town. Se further states, that never having learned to write, she makes a mark for her signature. (Signed with her mark) Elizabeth Beatty.
