Personally appeared before me John McMichael, William Beaty & Major William Sly to me, personally known to be credible witnesses who having been duly sworn depose and say that they served in the same company or Captain William Telford with the said Joseph Beaty in the Revolutionary War and have heard the preceding affidavit of the said Joseph Beaty read and that they are strictly true and the said William Beaty for himself saith that he is a younger brother of the said Joseph, lived in the same family with him in said war, and cannot be mistaken as to his service as a private in the army in the revolution and deponent's also say that the said Joseph is a man of good character and a credible witness & further say not. Bit it known that personally appeared before me the subscriber a justice of the peace within and for said county of Ulster in said state aged 44 years who being first duly sworn according to law and on her oath state that she is one of the children of Joseph Beaty deceased [?] resident of the county of Orange in said state who was in the war in the receipt of a pension at the time of his death at the rate of \$26-66 per annum for his services in and during the war of the Revolution under the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832 as she has been informed by her said father and that she believes the same to be true and that she has been advised and believes that she this deponent is entitled to an increase to said pension as one of the children of her father the said Joseph Beaty. She further states that her father left no widow at the time of his death. (Signed) Sarah Jane Bloodgood.
