

Pension Application for Allen Beebe

On this 13th day of July A.D. 1832 personally appeared before the Probate Court of Rutland Allen Beebe a resident of the County of Rutland and State of Vermont, aged 76 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States, in the year 11776 and served in Col. Woodbridge[s] Regiment of the Massachusetts line under the following named officers. Capt. Charles Cotton, Lieut Noah Warriner, Lieut Saml Buel, Ensign—Clerk of Long [Mirrow?] he enlisted in July and Ludlow Mass, where he then resided and was discharged at Ticonderoga in November or December the same year, having served four or five months.

In May the year that Cornwallis was taken he engaged in Sheldons Regiment of horse and served as teamster for foregoing, and served until December or January after, does not recollect the time he was discharged but knows it was after Thanksgiving in [?] having served about seven months.

The officers of the Regt were Col. Sheldon, Lt Col Jameson, & Maj. Tallmadge, we served on the lines above New York. He received no written discharge from either service. He marched from Springfield under Woodbridge, through Bennington to Ticonderoga, we were under the command of Genl Gates at Ticonderoga Genl Arnold was there.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity, except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any agency in any State. (Signed with his mark) Allen Beebe.
