

Pension Application for David Beebe or Beebee

R.12433 (Widow: Esther) Married September 28, 1810. He died April 2, 1831.

State of New York

Madison County SS

On this third day of April 1818 before me the Subscribed one of the Judges of the Court of Common pleas for the said County personally appeared David Beebe aged 55 years Resident in Brookfield in the said County who being by me first duly sworn according to law Doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the provision Made by the late act of Congress Entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War.

That he the Said David Beebe Enlisted at Wil Graham in the State of Massachusetts in the month of December 1780 for three years in the Company Commanded by Captain [bland] Hitchcock of the first Regiment of the first Brigade Massachusetts line commanded by Colonel Joseph Vorn.

That he Continued to serve in the said Corpos or in the Service of the United States until the Expiration of his inlistment viz until 25teh of December 1783 when he was discharged at West Point in the State of New York.

That he was in the battles of Kingsbridge and at the Taking of Cornwallis at Yorktown.

And that he is in Reduced Circumstances and Stands in need of the assistance of his Country for Support. And that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said Services more than he has now offers. The small remaining piece of his Discharge being produced the remainder of it is lost. (Signed) David Beebe
