

Pension Application for Aaron Beeman

Letter in folder dated October 25, 1935, written in response to an inquiry.

The record of Aaron Beeman follows, as found in claim for pension S.20287, based upon his service in the War of the Revolution.

Aaron Beeman was born in 1762 in Marlborough, Massachusetts; the names of soldier's parents are not shown.

While residing in said Marlborough, Massachusetts, he enlisted sometime in 1779, served six weeks as a private in Captain Barns' company, Colonel Ward's Massachusetts regiment, and was stationed at Tiverton, Rhode Island. He enlisted sometime in June, 1780, served as a private in Captain Watson's company, Colonel Wesson's 9th Massachusetts Regiment, and was discharged December 14, 1780.

Aaron Beeman was allowed pension on his application executed August 14, 1832, while a resident of Bridgeton, Cumberland County, Maine.

There are no family data in the claim.

In a deposition dated August 14, 1832, Aaron states that he was discharged at West Point on the 14th day of December AD 1780.
