

Pension Application for Joseph Bindon

This file doesn't have any service documentation. The only thing it really contains are letters from his son saying that his father served and that he wanted his pension. It appears as if the father dies a "few days" before the pension law was passed June 7, 1832 and therefore was not eligible. The son stated that his father was a commissary in the Clothing Department of the Army and that he was entitled to 2 years pay. The claim was presented to the House of Representatives Jan 3, 1854.

Sir. Mr. Joseph Bindon was a Canadian Refugee and drew lands for his services from New York. If he was returned as having served to the end of the war he may have been entitled to pay under the act of May 15, 1828. Respectfully yours, J.D. Woodward.
