

Pension Application for Ephraim Blanchard

S.44627 (Polly) Married "somewhere between 1780 and 1783 at Wallkill.

On this 10 day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Madison aforesaid, personally appears Ephraim Blanchard aged 60 years, resident in Cazenovia in the said county, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the aldn and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War;" That he the said Ephraim enlisted in Jany 1777 in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain John Wendell of the First New York commanded by Col. VanSchaick—New York Line, that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the U. States until the eighth of June 1779 was under Capt. John Ten Brook at the time of discharged from service in Newburgh Snake Hill state of New York, that he was in the battles of Cornwallis at Yorktown and Monmouth New Jersey, and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of said services.
