

### Pension Application for Lawrence Blazeur

Oneida County SS.

On this 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 personally appeared in open court now sitting, Lawrence Blazeur a resident of said county and state, aged sixty five years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated: That he was born at Manheim Herk. Co., N.Y. 1766 in Oct. Has no record of age in family bible. Lived at Manheim when entered service since war at Minden & Herkimer, at [?] now in Boonville N.Y. That in April 1781 he enlisted for nine months in Capt. Lawrence Gross Col., Col. Willett's Regt and served along the Mohawk River at Fort Herkimer & Fort Stanwix & other places & was discharged from service at Fort Plain in Dec having served nine mos. In April 1782 he enlisted in capta. French's 60 for nine mos. In Col Willet's Regt and served along the Mohawk River and was regularly discharged at expiration of nine months. Lt. Vrooman & Lt Hendrick's belonged to same co. never rec'd any written discharges—refers to annexed affidavits and papers. Col. Willet, Maj. Andrew Fink, Inspector (Signed with his mark) Lawrence Blazeur

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. Sworn to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid. Joseph B. Read, Dep. Clerk.
