

### **Pension Application for Abraham Boileau**

On this third day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Clinton personally appeared Abraham Boileau residing in the town of Champlain in the said County of Clinton, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the service of the United States in the revolutionary war."

That he the said Abraham Boileau enlisted in the Continental Army in the town of Fishkill in the State of New York sometime in the spring of 1780 in the company commanded by Capt. Clement Gaskin's company our Regiment commanded by Brigadier Genl Moses Hazen of the New York line of troops for and during the war.

That he continued with the said regiment in their different movements until the year of our Lord 1788 [sic] all the time in the service of the United States and was honorably discharged at New Windsor in the said State of New York.

That he is in reduced circumstances in life and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and further saith not. (Signed with his mark) Abraham Boileau.
