

Pension Application of David Booth

County of Hartford

David Booth of Berlin in s'd County being duly sworn doth depose & say that he served in the Revolutionary War on the Continental Establishment & in the New York Line for about sixteen months.—That he entered the service in the month of August 1782 to serve for three years as a private & faithfully served until after the peace viz in December 1783 when he was honorably discharged which discharge is lost

He belonged to Capt Simeon Newell's Company & Colo Marinus Willett Regt of the New York Line---

That he is a resident citizen of the U. States, has never had a pension, is in reduced circumstances & in need of assistance from his country for support. (Signed) David Booth

Sworn to & subscribed this 15 day of April 1818 before me, Jonathan Brace, Judge of the County Court for the County foresaid.

State of Connecticut, County of Hartford, SS. County Court, holden at Hartford in said County on the 2d Tuesday of August 1820.

On this 14th day of August 1820 personally appeared in open court, the same court being a court of record for said county, having the power of fine and imprisonment, David Booth aged seventy years, resident in Berlin in the County of Hartford, State of Connecticut who being first duly sworn according to law doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the revolutionary War as follows: That he enlisted into the army of the revolution in August AD 1782 in the company of Captain Simeon Newell of Southington in said Hartford County that he served in said army in Colonel Marinus Willett's regiment of the State of New York that he enlisted as aforesaid either for three years or during the war, he does not recollect which & served in pursuance of said enlistment in said army on the Continental establishment from the time of his said enlistment constantly until December 1783 being a period or term of sixteen months.

An I do solemnly swear, that I was a resident of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled, "An act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed."
