

### **Pension Application for Luke Bowman**

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldier of the Army of the Revolution", approved on the fifteenth of May 1828.

I, Luke Bowman now of the Village of Waddington, in the County of St. Lawrence, in the State of New York, do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental Line, of the Army of the Revolution, for and during the war and continued in its service, until its termination; at which period I was a private in Captain Pell's company (having first enlisted and served in Captain Peter VanRensselaer's Company in Col. James Livingston's Regiment of which I was drafted into said Captain Pell's Company in the Regiment commanded by Col. Van Cortlandt & in the Brigade of Gen VanSchoick, the number of which I cannot recollect, in the New York line.

And I also declare that I afterwards received a certificate for the reward of eighty dollars to which I suppose I was entitled, under a resolve of Congress, passed the 15<sup>th</sup> May 1778.

And I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of March 1828 on the pension list of the United States. (Signed) Luke Bowman
