

Pension Application for Christopher Brady

Of Record and having a seal under the authority of said state; personally appeared in open court Christopher Brady aged 75 years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of the 18th of March 1818 & the 1st of May 1820 that he the said Brady enlisted for the term of the war on or about the day of Sept'r or thereabouts in the year 1777 in the State of New York in the company commanded by Capt. William Saterlee in the regiment commanded by Col. Moses called Congress' regiment not belonging to the line of any particular state on the continental establishment; that he continued to serve in the corps until after the close of the war when he was discharged from the said service in Pumpton in the State of New Jersey.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th March eighteen hundred and eighteen and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed and I do further declare that I have no occupation and am supported by public charity and that I have no family residing with me. All which is subscribed by me the day & year aforesaid. (Signed with his mark) Christopher Brady

At a County Court held in and for the County of at New Haven in the District and State of Connecticut commencing on the 3rd Tuesday of march 1823 the same being a court of record and having a seal by virtue of the laws of said state; on this the 2nd day of April 1823 during the term—personally appeared in open court Christopher Brady a resident in the town of New Haven in the County of New Haven in said state, and exhibited and subscribed the following schedule and made solemn oath that the same in a true and perfect schedule of all his income and property (necessary clothing and begging excepted) viz, "Nothing".
