

Pension Application for Lewis Brady

On this 20th day of April in the year 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for the said County of Dutchess personally appeared Lewis Brady aged sixty years resident in the town of Beekman in the said County of Dutchess.

Who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress Entitled an act of provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War”.

That he the said Lewis Brady enlisted in the year 1778 (/according to the best of his recollection) in Capt. Samuel Pells Company in the Regiment commanded by Col’n VanCortland in the New York Line for and during the war that he continued in the service of the United States until the end of the war that he received a regular written discharge while the army was laying about five miles from Newburgh in the County of Orange in the State of New York at the close of the war but that he has lost the same that he served five years that he was at the taking of Cornwallis at YorkTown and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said service.
