

### **Pension Application for Nicholas Brandow**

[Transcriber's note. Some of the pages seem to be missing for this claimant. In this case, the letter dated October 22, 1927, written in response to an inquiry will be used. Ajberry]

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim R.1157, it appears that Nicholas Brandow was born January 8, 1757, in Catskill, Albany County which was later Greene County, New York.

He alleged that he served with the New York troops as follows:

From October, 1777, two months in Captain John Woodbeck's Company in Colonel Anthony VanBergen's Regiment.

From August 23 or 24, 1781, until December 25, 1781, under Lieutenant Wessel Salisbury.

From June, 1782 until August 5, 1782, under Lieutenant Wessel Salisbury.

From October 4, 1782, until October 13, 1782, under Lieutenant Wessel Salisbury.

He applied for pension September 1, 1834, at which time he was living in Catskill, New York. His claim was not allowed as he failed to furnish proof of service as required by the pension laws.

He had a son, Isaiah, living in Catskill, New York, in 1834.

From the papers in the pension claim of Jonathan Bartholomew, S.12068, it appears that he was born February 23, 1755, at Wallingford, New Haven County, Connecticut. There are no data on file relative to his marriage.
