

### **Pension Application for Henry Brewer**

On this second day of May 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in & for said County, personally appears, Henry Brewer, aged fifty seven years, resident in the town of Union in said County, who being by me duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service for the United States in the Revolutionary War.

That he the said Henry Brewer enlisted in the service of the United States, in the month of January 1782 in the County of Dutchess, in the State of New York in the company commanded by Capt. John Campbell in the New York line for the term of one year; that he continued to serve in the said corps, until the first day of January 1783, when he was discharged from service at the Highlands in said County of Dutchess--& that his discharge has been accidentally destroyed by fire--& that he is in reduced circumstances, & stands in need of the assistance of his country for support -- & that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.

The date and place of birth of this soldier, Henry Brewer, are not shown in the claim, nor are the names of his parents given.

Henry Brewer enlisted in January, 1780 or 1782, in Dutchess County, New York and served one year as a private in Captain Campbell's New York company and was discharged at the Highlands in Dutchess County, New York.

This soldier, Henry Brewer, was allowed pension on his application executed May 2, 1818 then aged fifty-seven years and living in Union, Broome County, New York.

He was living in 1820 in Chenango County, New York and his wife, Cybell, was then aged fifty-eight years. He at this time referred to the following children—Esther aged twenty-six years, Isaac aged sixteen years, and Cybell aged fourteen years.

This soldier, Henry Brewer, was living in 1837 in the state of Ohio and made affidavit in Richland County, Ohio; he stated at this time that his children were residing in the state of Ohio.

There are no further data in this claim concerning the family of Henry Brewer.
