SS. Lyme April Session 1818—

Be it remembered that at said Lyme on the 2nd day of April AD 1818 before me, Jeremiah G. Brainard a Judge of the Superior Court of the State of Connecticut, personally came and appeared Henry Brown of the Town of said Lyme in the County of New London in the State of Connecticut and being duly and solemnly sworn according to Law and the usage of this state did on his said oath by me to him administered declare depose and say that at Long Island in the State of New York sometime in the month of April 1775 he enlisted as a soldier for the term of nine months in Capt. Daniel Griffins Company Henry B. Livingston's Regiment in the New York Line on the Continental Establishment That he faithfully served in said capacity during the full period of his enlistment & was discharged in the month of January 1776. He then returned home & that in April 1776 he again enlisted as a sergeant in Capt. Daniel Rose's Company and he thinks Col. Henry B. Livingston's Regiment in the New York line that he immediately joined his regiment and faithfully served in said capacity until the expiration of the term for which he enlisted making about twenty on months he served in the Army of the United States against the common enemy in the Revolutionary War and that he was discharged he thinks he had one that it is lost or destroyed by time or accident. That from his reduced circumstances he needs the assistance of his country for support that he us 78 years if age. (Signed) Henry Brown
