

Pension Application for William Buchanan

On this 28 April 1818 before me the subscriber, first Judge of the County of Orange, in the said state, personally appeared William Buchannan, aged 59 years resident in BloomingGrove in said County who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" that he the said William Buchanan enlisted in New Windsor in the State of New York in the company commanded by Capt. Andrew Moody, Col'n Lamb's Reg't Levies. That he continued to serve in the said Corps or in the service of the United States when he was discharged from service at West Point by Mayor Bowman's – that he was in the battle of Fort Montgomery—that he is in reduced circumstances & stands in need of the assistance of his country for support—I that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
